Hector Guerrero became El Ayudante's Construction Coordinator and Architect in Nicaragua on May 30, 2003. He was one of five candidates called for an interview after responding to an ad placed in the national newspaper. Hector was excited to know that he was chosen "to serve our Lord through such a project of love for the children."

Hector grew up in the city of Granada, later moving to El Salvador where he completed his high school education. Upon returning to Nicaragua, he studied at the Nicaragua Engineering University in Managua. Previously, Hector has been employed by the mayor's office in the city of Granada, other government institutions, private construction companies, as well as some NGO's.

As construction coordinator, Hector has under his direct supervision two permanent staff members and over twenty part-time employees. He has designed and directed the construction of the orphanage and medical clinic located on the 18 manzanas and various projects in the community including: churches, homes, a library, preschools, and renovation of an elementary school.

Since the very first day he visited Hogar Cristiano Nicaraguense, Hector has "felt the presence of God and witnessed the great love of the North Americans toward our unprotected children in Nicaragua that come from the poorest homes." According to Hector, serving with the various mission teams has been important in his spiritual growth. Hector and his wife, Angelica Maria, have one son, Luis Manuel, and a child on the way.
